Homelessness in King County

The Point-in-Time (PIT) Count is required every other year by the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) in order to receive federal funding. However, it is widely understood to be an undercount. The PIT has traditionally been conducted as a one-night census by volunteers in January.

According to the 2022 PIT, 13,368 individuals are experiencing homelessness of which 57% are unsheltered and 43% are sheltered.

Homelessness continues to have a disproportionate impact on communities of color. Based on the PIT analyses, 25% of people experiencing homelessness in King County identify as Black/African American, but according to the 2020 U.S. Census only 7% of King County's population identifies as Black/African American. Similarly, 9% of people experiencing homelessness identify as American Indian, Alaskan Native, or Indigenous, but that group makes up only 1% of King County's population.

OUR SOLUTION

Transitional Housing

Attain Housing provides family-centered housing and services to King County residents who are experiencing homelessness. While meeting their critical needs for housing and services, Attain Housing assists families as they work to transform their lives. Our housing units are located in Kirkland and Bellevue.

Attain Housing works with families in crisis to stabilize their situation. At the heart of Attain Housing's Transitional Program is case management, a structured program in which participants regularly meet with trained case managers to establish and work toward individualized goals. As families achieve their goals, including gaining employment skills, improving credit, or furthering their education, they interrupt the cycle of homelessness by building the strength to return to self-determination and self-sufficiency.

In 2022, Attain supported 52 adults and 93 children. Our case managers logged 2815 hours with their clients, walking alongside them in their efforts to make lasting life changes and secure permanent housing. 75% of families with whom case managers worked for six months or more transitioned into sustainable permanent housing, a testament to case managers' focus on client empowerment.



Stable Home



When a family is evicted, the process—both legally and personally—can take time away from attending school or work. Income is lost for the time spent out of work dealing with an eviction, putting families even deeper in the hole financially and even risking their jobs altogether. It's a cascade of negative impacts that compound but if that cascade of instability is halted by investing in preventing the eviction altogether, the saved costs add up to greater social benefit.

Qualifying families living on the Eastside are able to receive support for eviction prevention. In 2022, Attain Housing prevented 195 families (including 370 children and 305 adults) from losing their housing.

The Eastside wants to be a community that no longer is picking up the pieces after a family is traumatized from homelessness. Instead, we want our community to ensure that not one family ends up homeless in the first place. Investing in our community helps prevent homelessness. And in preventing homelessness, the benefit is more than money. It's also preventing trauma, potential or increased addiction or mental illness, and the cycle of poverty that is passed from parents to their children. Most importantly, it will literally save lives.

OUR IMPACT

Like many parents, Sam is struggling to provide a stable home for his two boys. In 2016, a failed family business and a few missed house payments caused them to lose their home. Unfortunately, Sam's story isn't unique.

As of December of 2022, 64% of Americans were living paycheck to paycheck, according to a recent Lending Club report, making families vulnerable to homelessness. Even though wage growth is high by historical standards, it isn't keeping up with the increased cost of living, which in December was up 6.5% from the prior year.

For the past year, Attain Housing has been serving as the fallback cushion for Sam and his 11 and 12 year old boys that many families in the Eastside desperately need. Our transitional housing program allows families to move into a one, two, or three bedroom home for up to two years. Along with a stable place to live, families receive case management.


Through case management, families are able to learn about community resources, and set their individualized goals. For Sam, his goals were to get a job, put money aside for debt payments, and apply for other housing opportunities. With weekly check-ins with his case manager, Sam is able to stay focused on achieving his goals.

"I have a job now," Sam said with pride. "And I am saving money and filling out 3–4 housing applications each month" he continued. "A dream for me and my boys is to be financially secure and have a stable home of our own. Thanks to Attain, I am able to work toward my dream".


In 2022, Attain Housing provided 2815 hours of case management and served 52 adults and 93 children through our Transitional Housing Program. The Eastside community has the power to completely change the trajectory of not only an individual's life, but the lives of their children, their children's children, and their families for years to come. There is a large generational impact of homelessness, and our goal is to make it a positive one.




